- 9. On May 23 & 24, what does Charlie notice about Algernon's personality?
- 10. Why do you think Dr. Nemur and Dr. Strauss ask Charlie not to return to the lab anymore?
- 11. After leaving Nemur and Strauss, what does Charlie's work ethic look like?
- 12. Why do you think Charlie is now going by "Charles Gordon"?
- 13. On June 5, what starts happening to Algernon? What epiphany does Charlie come to regarding his own condition?
- 14. Put this statement into simpler terms: "Artificially increased intelligence deteriorates at a rate of time directly proportional to the quantity of the increase"?

Things to consider: "educated in the tradition of narrow specialization" (doctoral degree), ancient languages (Latin, Greek, and Hebrew) (Hindustani and Chinese), inferiority vs. superiority complex, irony of Dr. Strauss's comment, mob mentality (Charlie laughed at the bus boy), "people think nothing of abusing a man born with low intelligence", "there are so many doors to open", Charlie's publication, special connection with Algernon, Paradise Lost allusion (fall from grace, original sin, temptation), pleading with God not to take it all away, compares his deterioration to senility/second childhood, "the blank expression, the silly smile, the people laughing at him", "it's slipping away like sand through my fingers" (simile), [the doctor] "smiled when I told him I used to be a genius. He talked to me like I was a baby and he winked at Mrs. Flynn. I got mad and chased him out because he was making fun of me the way they all used to"
